The Application process:

Respond to the Request for Proposals (RFP) distributed in the Bugle, email list and Next Door, October – December.

• Submit a brief summary of your proposal to jessicasusanwiley@gmail.com from October to December 1.

Complete an electronic form sent to each proposer to articulate specifics of the project by December 31.

- Description of the project
- Who will lead the project?
- What will it involve?
- How much funding is needed?

The committee evaluates suggestions using the criteria listed below.

- Is there leadership (an identified neighbor) to get the project done?
- Is it possible (politically, physically)?
- Does it meet the budget (\$0 \$5000)?
- Is it sustainable long term?
- Does it have neighborhood wide impact?

Proposals chosen for funding will be notified following the February BMNA board meeting.
