BMNA Festival of Garage Sales May 4-5, 2019

Clean out the garage, organize your goods and get ready for the shoppers! The Bryn Mawr Festival of Garage Sales is May 4th and 5th this year.

Please register your garage sale with BMNA which sponsors the event. The Festival of Garage Sales is the largest neighborhood garage sale in the city and we welcome thousands of people every year. The registration fees we collect are used to pay for the portable bathrooms and printing. Not only does your money help with these expenses, it is also used to advertise your garage sale and the items you are selling. BMNA compiles a list of registered



sales for the public. We post this list on our website and have copies at local businesses and at each registered garage sale.

We have increased the registration fee from \$15 to \$18 in part because the cost of portable bathrooms has increased 25%. This is the first time the registration fee has been raised in 12 years.

Please register your sale at bmna.org or complete the registration form on this page. The deadline for registrations is Tuesday, April 30th. Each garage sale registered with BMNA will receive a Bryn Mawr sticker.

In years past, BMNA has hosted a garage sale with donated goods from our generous neighbors. We have decided to discontinue this sale and focus our efforts on supporting other aspects of the event. Keep your fingers crossed for good weather!

Susan Verrett moved to approve the Agenda. Seconded. Motion carried.

Jay Peterson moved to approve last month’s minutes. Seconded. Motion carried.

Lisa Goodman presented a report from the City of Minneapolis
Lunch with Lisa in February was cancelled rescheduled March 27th at noon at the University of St Thomas. Developer panel will speak on affordable housing, as well as rehab and high-rise development.

February recorded one of the highest snowfalls. 1200 sidewalk citations have been written. Citations are not being written for ice.

Please report potholes to 311. The City relies on the public to identify potholes that need filling.

Steve Minn was scheduled to speak for Lupe Development on the 2800 Wayzata Project, but as he was unable to attend, Aaron Diedrich, Cameron Flacknie, and David Miller presented in his stead. Presentation was on the two buildings slated for the westside of the lot. One will be market rate on the north and affordable housing on the south.

Three concepts were presented with the footprint consistent across the concepts. Each consisted of 200 units, 100 market rate, 100 senior, with 200 underground parking stalls.

Officer Warzinik spoke briefly on a shooting incident at PennWood market. A suspect has been identified.

Dennis Fazio presented a Treasurer’s report. Taxes are done and the attorney general report has been completed. Board approval is required to file and send to IRS. Dennis Fazio moved to approve the taxes and file. Seconded. Motion carried.

Dennis Fazio also presented an update on the 2020 plan. A response was drafted by Dennis Fazio, expressing the areas that BMNA suggested removal or augmentation. Jay asked questions about

Lynda Shaheen expressed an opinion against having all the neighborhood annual meetings on the same day on some of the language in the 2020 plan response. Jay Peterson expressed an opinion agreeing with the sentiment that the language could be less colorful.

Barry Schade moved to approve the Official BMNA response as discussed and amended. Seconded. Motion carried.

Lynda Shaheen BMNA Coordinator gave a report. NiceRide is taking input for locations for its locations should be. BMNA purchased neighborhood stickers, for sale now. Some of the funds used to purchase have already been recovered through sales at Winterfest. Though some lessons were learned on how to improve it was an enormous success and was enjoyed by many.

The tip jar at Bryan Mawr market is now set to collect donations for BMNA.

Winterfest generated 2000 in sponsorship, 3000 in tickets. \$1000 in silent auction. The BMNA will net around \$4500.

Event Coordinator Patty Wycoff thanked everyone for the hard work to make this event so successful in such short timeframe.

BMNA has decided not to host a sale at the Garage sale. Instead, BMNA will take the responsibilities for the food trucks. Registration for the sale will be raised to \$20, and special attention will be given to improving the maps of the sales.

JoEllyn Jolstad’s Bugle Report was read in absentia. The March Bugle came out a couple of days late due to the weather. This enabled us to include a report and photos from the BMNA Winter Fest event.

The deadline for submissions for the April 2019 Bugle is Wednesday, March 20. No board member has signed up to write or solicit an article for the April edition.

Jeremy Staffeld presented an update on the Webmaster. The Wordpress update has been completed. He is working on updating the membership coupons. Next up will be working on the newsletter mailing.

Communications Committee is meeting next week to discuss the Land Use plan.

Lynda Shaheen reported on the Schools Committee. March 31st is the next and final indoor playdate. 5-6 families attended the last.

Jessica Wiley, Community Projects Chair, sent an update on the community projects in advance.

Nominations Committee: Elections are coming up soon. Interested parties can reach out to Brian Treece.

Karen Frederickson gave a report on the Gateway Art project. Coordination with the Light Rail has been occurring. MnDOT will cover the green/soft scape materials. Most neighbors seem to prefer a return to the hedge, so options for this are being reviewed.

ROC, Vida Ditter reported on ROC by Proxy. The EXL building has removed the charter school and is now being planned as an office building. The planned addition of another level has been requested and a letter of support has been submitted.

With nothing further, meeting was adjourned.

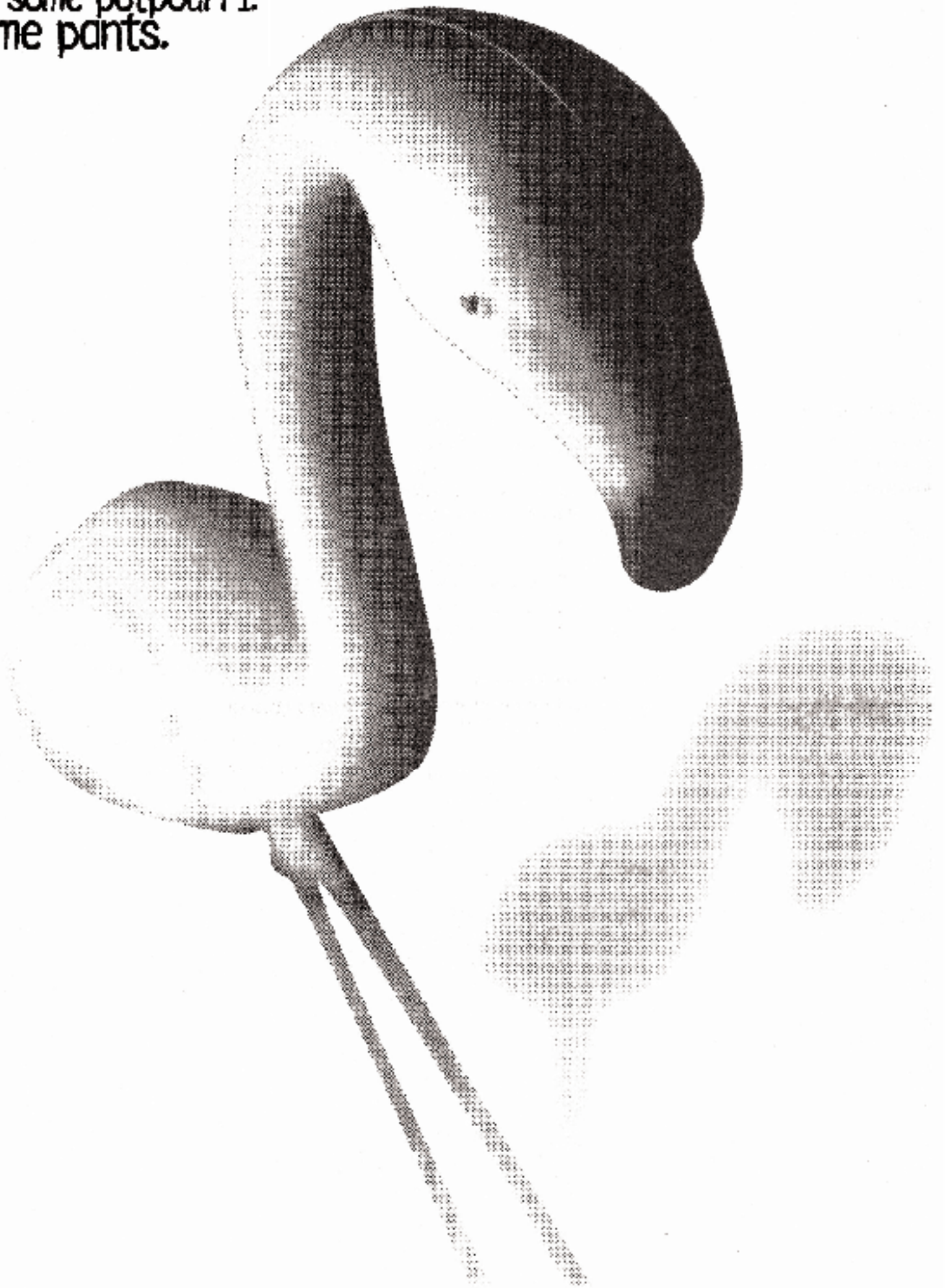

Each year at the annual meeting in the second week of May, there are elections for BMNA area representatives. This year Areas 1, 3, 5 and 7 will be on the ballot.

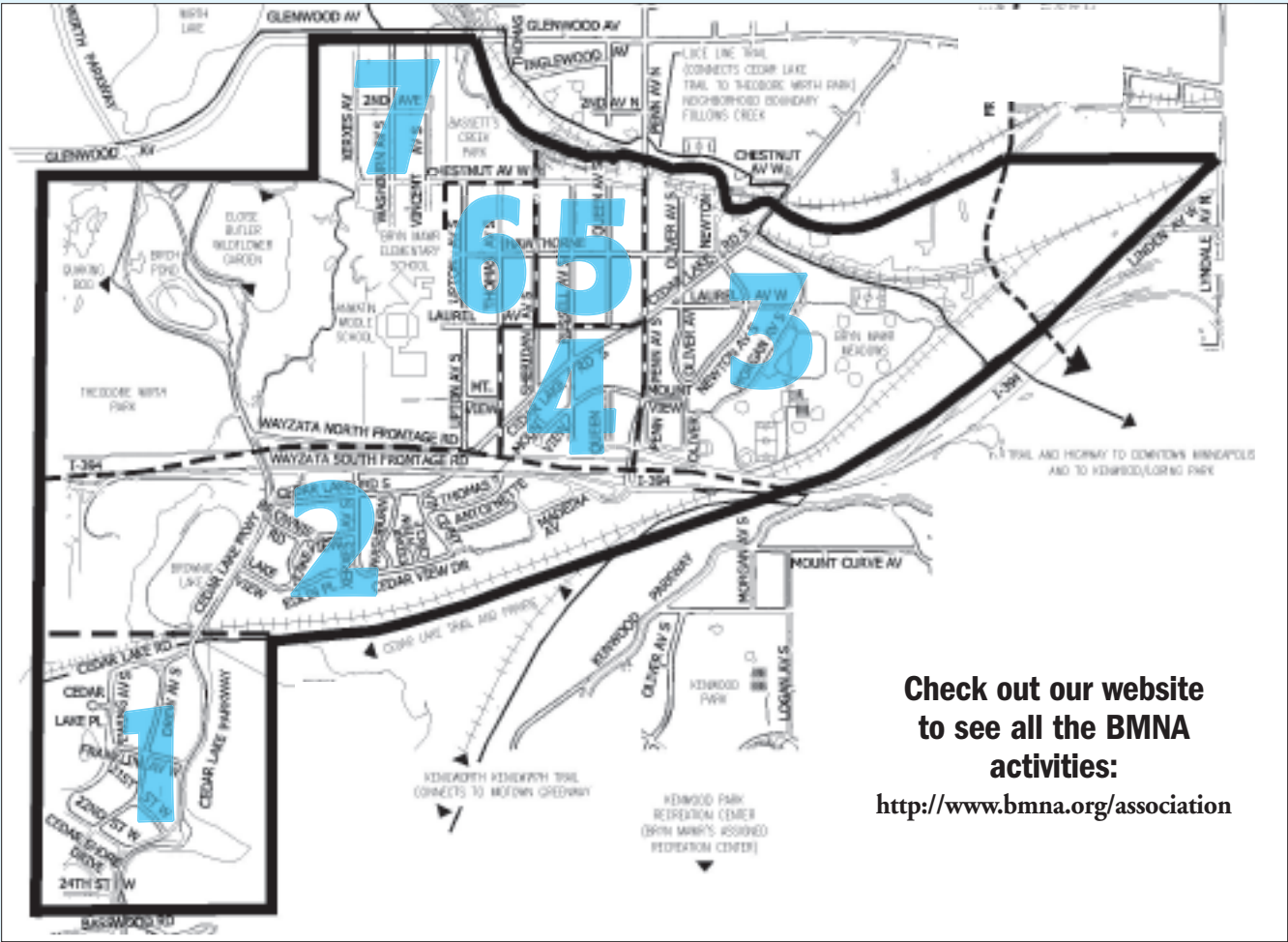
Check out the map for the boundaries for your area.

Anwatin CST Helps People Who are Homeless

We are the Anwatin Community Service Team (CST). For our winter service learning project, we decided to make blankets for people who are homeless. The blankets were tied and made out of fleece. It was a 7 step process.

- Cut 5 inch strips around the perimeter of the blankets
- Knotted each cut strip twice on the blankets and taking out the pins

Some people cut, some people pinned, some people tied; that's how we all worked together to make all 10 blankets. Once we were finished, we gave the blankets to Mr. Law, "The Sandwich Man".

Mr. Law works with people who are homeless. He helps people during the night when the shelters are closed. He gives them food, bus tokens and other things they may need. The CST also gave him 10 blankets to share with anyone who needs one.

Brainstorming ideas for blankets

- Where the blankets would go
- Purchased fabric
- Cut fabric evenly to be 2.5 by 2.5 yards each
- Pinned two pieces of fabric together around the perimeter and cut a 5 by 5 inch square on each corner

Bryn Mawr Moms on the Search for Good Books & Food

The Warmth of Other Suns – The Epic Story of America's Great Migration
Isabel Wilkerson

"Why didn't I learn about this?" was one of the most common reactions of the Bryn Mawr Moms as we discussed this latest book club selection. The story of African American migrants from the segregated, impoverished Jim Crow south to the job rich industrial north is a part of American history that was often left out of high school history curriculum, and if it was touched upon, did not register with many students. This book proposed to correct that and to make a connection with readers using very detailed personal stories of three different migration participants, each from a different part of the south, in a different decade. Ida Mae Brandon Gladney moves from the sharecropping cotton fields of Mississippi to settle in Chicago, George Swanson Starling moves from central Florida where he'd become dangerously involved with workers rights in the orange groves, to New York City, and Robert Pershing Foster, a surgeon who could not get privileges to practice medicine in his hometown hospital in Monroe, Louisiana, moves to southern California.

In the process of relating each of these unique stories, the author tells of the migration of six million southern blacks moving north from 1916 – 1940 and another five million from 1940 - 1970. The book is based on over 1,200 interviews of the now aging migrants and their families over 15 years. It was published in

2010. The title comes from a Richard Wright poem published in 1945:

...I was taking a part of the South
To transplant in alien soil...
Respond to the warmth of other suns
And, perhaps, to bloom.

In addition to the compelling stories of these three families, the book does considerable analysis of the why of the migration, and of its outcome. Why did some migrate, and some say in the South? How did the first generation of migrants fare? How do they compare with their counterparts that stayed? How and why did the children of these migrants not fare so well? How did this migration affect the growth of northern cities? The development, or lack thereof, of the South? So many issues to discuss.

We also compared this migration to the currently ongoing movement of African and Middle Eastern migrants into Europe and of South and Central Americans attempt to migrate to North America. Surely we can learn from this earlier migration and prepare for better outcomes in the present day.

There is so much to learn from this book. It is compellingly written though a bit long and a little repetitious (one who shall remain unnamed, skipped the middle part).

Nevertheless, we heartily recommend it.

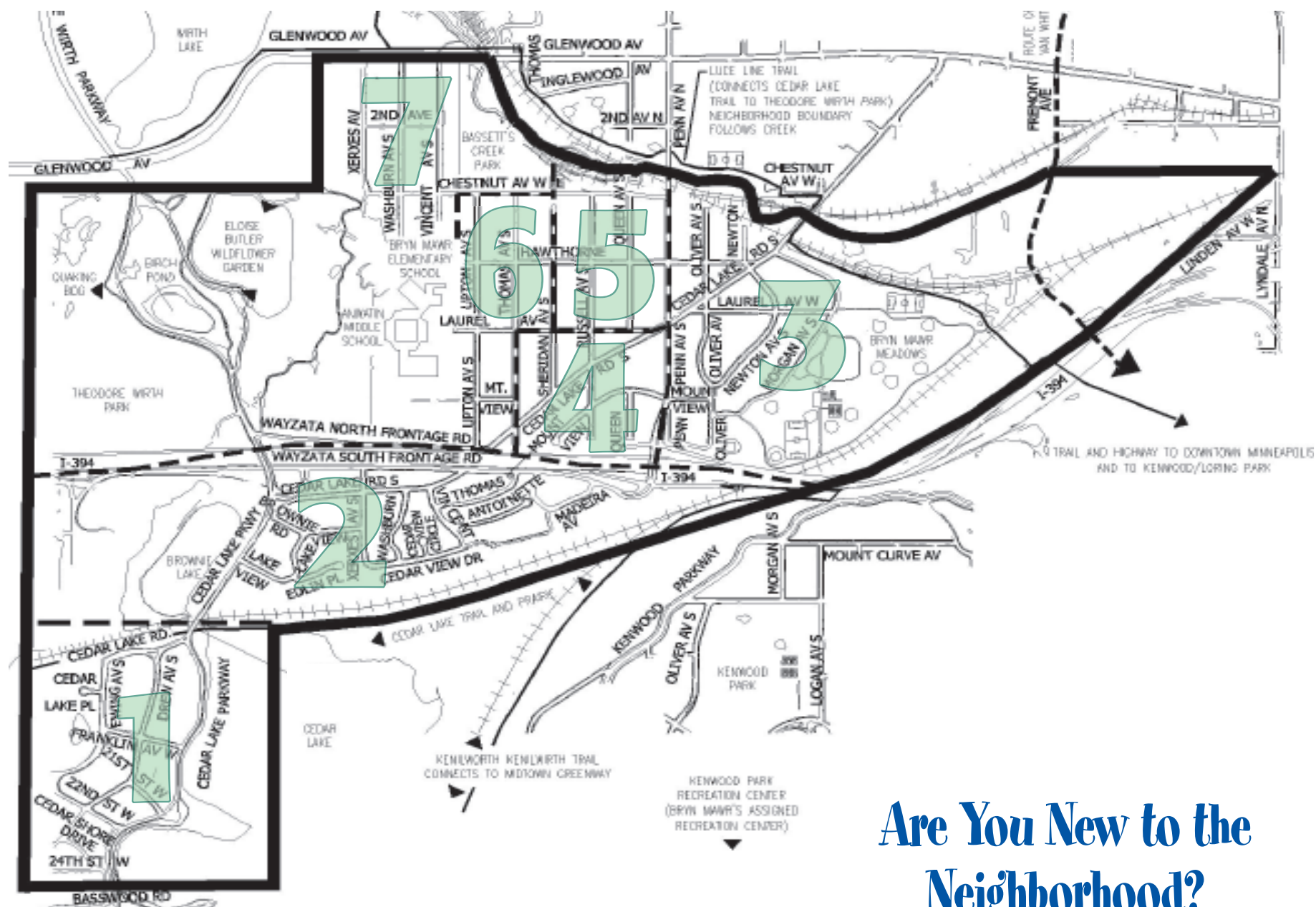
