Dennis Fazio provided and presented the Treasurer's Report. Dennis Fazio moved to accept the Treasurer's report. Seconded. Motion carried.

Lynda Shaheen presented on Communications and Fundraising. Lynda is starting on her second year in the role. Member night at Utepils was successful, reaching 60 renewals and 17 new members. Also included sticker and T-shirt sales. \$755 in donations and \$185 in sales total. Sip and Stroll is tomorrow night and the after party will be held at La Mesa. Thirteen business are participating.

Event Coordinator Report by Molly Erdmann report read by Brian Treece in absentia. Horses have been reserved for Saturnalia. Dates for Harvest Dinner is set.

JoEllyn Jolstad, Bugle editor, provided an update. Need Board volunteers to write articles. Some turnover in the local distribution of the bugle. No edition in January so get your postings in soon.

Webmaster Jeremy Staffeld reported that the online store has been updated to allow for easier sales process. Wordpress has been upgraded, and server needs to be upgraded by the server host. Live Streaming has not gone as hoped. Issue with hosting and recording. Bmna.org/monthlymeeting-streaming to view previous months recordings.

Community Projects update by Jessica Wiley. Doggie stations are up and being used. The sign for the Mosaic piece has been posted. Suggested projects for next year are now being accepted. Email Jessica if you have an idea you'd like to suggest.

Sip and Stroll tomorrow, Harvest Dinner 11/20, Saturnalia 12/14.

The City performed a financial overview of BMNA and provided findings. One was that we have 5 independent contractors, and that BMNA is able to justify for the IRS the reasons for having independent contractors instead of employees.

Gateway Art (temp committee) – Timbre Rogers volunteered to join the Gateway Art Committee.

Two of the three armed robbery suspects involved in the Laurel Ave armed robbery have been apprehended. There seems to be suspicious activity on Chestnut between Russell and Sheridan. Reminder, please lock your doors. A question was posed as to the safety plan for the light rail. Rowena Holmes spoke to several contractors engaged in securing the area under construction. Questions were posed as to security for the former CenturyLink building as there has been some break ins, and vehicular trespassing. There has not been a tenant identified yet.

Schools Committee: Taste of Anwatin is coming and Molly has been actively working on the event. MPLS Public Schools is contemplating changes. Lynda Shaheen will continue to report on that.



Timeline:

Ideas will be solicited from now until December 31, 2019. The committee will meet in January 2020 to identify workable projects and make a recommendation to the board at their February 2020 board meeting.

The process:

Request for proposals October-December 2019. Submit proposals to jessicasusanwiley@gmail.com by December 31, 20189

Those who have submitted an idea will be asked to complete a brief form about specifics of the project.

Who will lead the project? What will it involve? How much funding is needed?

The committee evaluates suggestions using the criteria listed below.

Is there leadership (an identified neighbor) to get the project done? Is it possible (politically, physically)?

- Does it meet the budget (\$0 \$5000)?
- Is it sustainable long term?
- Does it have neighborhood wide impact?



Kenilworth LRT Tunnel Construction to Begin

The Southwest LRT project will begin sheet piling for the Kenilworth LRT Tunnel in late October or early November. The project has made progress this Fall in completing significant site preparation and temporarily shifting freight rail along the tunnel segment. Due to the complex nature of the tunnel construction site and the overall duration, a press-in-piler is being used.

The contractor plans to start tunnel sheet piling work near Park Siding Park and will move north towards Cedar Lake Parkway. Sheeting installation is expected to last until summer 2020 with two pressin-pilers active in the corridor. Tunnel excavation is anticipated to begin Spring 2020. The most visible civil construction work on the tunnel is expected to take two years.

Update for Fall Street Sweeping

Bryn Mawr is scheduled for the week of November 11 for your week and date go to minneapolismn.gov/streetsweeping.

Crews are preparing to sweep streets across Minneapolis to clean the streets before winter to keep leaves and debris out of the storm drains and ending up in our lakes and rivers as much as possible.

During the four weeks of the comprehensive fall street sweep, crews will clean about 1,000 miles of city streets. To make sure crews can do the best job possible, temporary "No Parking" signs will be posted at least 24 hours in advance so streets will be clear of cars when they're swept. The first signs will be posted Monday, Oct. 21, and sweeping will begin the next day. Anyone who parks on the street will need to follow posted parking rules or their cars may be ticketed and towed.


