City of Minneapolis -**Councilperson Lisa Goodman**

Bassett Creek Watershed Update and Public Input Request. Laura Jester and Jody Polzin

Watershed formed in 1969 as a 9-city regional governmental organization to protect water quality. The watershed encompasses 40 square miles, supported financially by contributions from members and tax levies for large capital projects. Bassett Creek flows out of Medicine Lake. Recent projects include improving Bassett Creek across from Fruen Mill. Current project in collaboration with MPRB and City of Mpls includes building water quality ponds in the Meadows, 45 acres being diverted to

the ponds.Tree replacement plan is in the works. Upcoming project involves Theo Wirth, dredging 3 lagoons that have contaminated sediment. Will remove phosphorus that moves downstream. Starting a new 10- year plan from 2025 – 2035 to address challenges like climate resiliency. April - Dec 2022, gathering input. Survey open. www.bassettcreekwmo.org Looking at watershed work to address environment inequities and mitigate harm to vulnerable communities. Feb - Mar 2023 kick off meeting to review input. Asked about development at Fruen Mill. Particularly challenging area as it is in the floodplain. Talked about tree removal at the Meadows for the new park. Will contact Tyler to clarify what the plan is for tree replacement. Asked about daylighting the







Bryn Mawr Film Series Starting in January

The BMNA and Racial Justice Committee will be hosting a series of film screenings, kicking off with The Co-op Wars, directed by Bryn Mawr neighbor, Deacon Warner.

The Co-op Wars is a one hour documentary that looks at the often forgotten and tumultuous history of the natural food co-op movement in the Twin Cities.As many of us know, the Twin Cities has among the strongest network of food co-ops in the country. However, what is not as commonly known, is the heated debate over who the co-ops serve and what their ultimate purpose is.That debate brings up questions of racial inclusion, class, politics, and inequities in our food system.As the film illustrates, these questions are very much alive in the food co-op movement today.After the film screening there will be time for discussion and to hear from some of the filmmakers.

This screening of The Co-op Wars will be at the SRF Building auditorium, 3701 S Wayzata Blvd, on Thursday, January 19th, at 7pm. 
Tinter is upon us! As the snow falls, the Loppet Foundation works hard to get the trails ready for skiers, walkers, fat tire bikers, skijorers and snowshoers. The Loppet Foundation grooms and maintains dozens of kilometers of winter trails throughout Minneapolis, including all the trails in Theodore Wirth Park, the Chain of Lakes, Columbia Golf Course and Hiawatha Golf Course. This year the trails running through the Bryn Mawr woods will be groomed in the same direction that they were groomed last year. When you are visiting the woods adjacent to Anwatin Middle School and Bryn Mawr Elementary be on the lookout for our Junior Loppet and Minne-Loppet teams. These intrepid young skiers are learning how to ski through Foundation programming. Trails throughout the system range from beginner to expert level, and include dazzling views of the Minneapolis skyline, serenity in the quaking bog and winter wildlife sightings.

Last year, the Loppet added a groomed walking trail alongside the ski trail on the chain of lakes. Based on positive feedback, this will continue again this winter when conditions allow. There are many trails throughout the system that are multi-use meaning skiers, hikers and snowshoers are all welcome. The Foundation asks that users share the trails respectfully with all.Visit loppet.org/trails to find maps and more information on all trails available, what usage is allowed and more on trail etiquette. Please also note that the Kennelwirth channel that connects Cedar Lake and Lake of the Isles is closed during the winter of 2022-2023 due to construction. It will be open temporarily for the City of Lakes Loppet Winter Festival.

In addition to the trails throughout the city, the Loppet Foundation's home base in the Trailhead offers many winter recreation options. Come out to Theodore Wirth Park and try the beginners alpine hill (snowboarders, alpine skiers and snowskaters welcome!), the tubing hill or the sledding hill. New this year we will be renting fat tire bikes in addition to skate and classic ski rentals. If you are new to skiing or just need a refresher - you can sign up for individual or group lessons. There is something for all members of the family - regardless of age or ability. The Trailhead also offers delicious food and drinks at Mill Valley Market, music on Friday nights and fun events and programs throughout the year. The most useful tool I have found for gardening is a hori hori knife. A hori hori knife is a must-have tool for every gardener. It has many uses, but is especially effective in transplanting and dividing plants. Because it has a serrated edge, a cutting edge and a sharp point, it is wise to include a sheath with the hori hori knife. My favorite is the Hori Hori Ultimate made by Barebones.

Some gardeners love to read when they are not digging. A book by Doug Tallamy, "Nature's Best Hope," is at the top of my list. Doug presents a most moving argument for conservation practices that start in your own yard. He has changed my thinking about gardening and how gardening fits into a broader community of all living things. Doug is a founder of the Homegrown National Park organization and a very popular lecturer.

Robin Wall Kimmerer has written "Braiding Sweetgrass," a big hit with my gardening friends. The book is a sweet blend of poetry, scientific study and indigenous wisdom. Robin invites the reader into an easy but deep dive into wondrous teachings about plants.

I like memberships that offer continuing experiences throughout the year. The Landscape Arboretum is an inspiring and exciting place to visit in all seasons. If you give or receive an Arb membership, be sure to make it a "Duo" so someone, perhaps you, can go along with the recipient.

A membership in the Minnesota State Horticultural Society is also a great option for gardeners. Besides receiving the "Northern Gardener" magazine, a Horticultural Society member receives discounts at most local nurseries and many learning events.

Have fun giving delight to your gardeners. You might want to drop hints for yourself.






