- 3. Approval of minutes of last month's meeting. Moved, Seconded and Passed.
- 4. City of Minneapolis: Councilmember Lisa Goodman's Report
 - Last Lunch w/Lisa is Oct. 21st at University of St. Thomas. Secretary of State, Steve Simon will be the guest speaking about the 50th anniversary of voting rights act.
 - street sweeping begins Oct. 20th
 - Cedar Lake Parkway will be closed for 6 days beginning Oct. 19th
- 5. Treasurer's Report
 - 3rd Quarter Treasurer's report with notes attached to these minutes.

- 6. Draft Community Engagement Plan for Bassett's Creek Park Improvements—Tyler Pedersen, MPRB
 - Bassett's Creek Park is located at Chestnut and Thomas Ave. S. Many neighbors refer to this park as "Chestnut" park.
 - Dollars allocated are just over \$400,000
 - This is the 1st engagement with neighborhood.
 - Community Engagement Plan will be complete around Nov. 4th and the first community engagement meeting with Bryn Mawr will be around Dec. 1st
- 7. Traffic Issues—Penn Ave. Alley (next to Bassett Creek Art bldg.), Chestnut Ave.—Jessica
 - Cars park too close to the alley on the south side of Bassetts Creek Arts. When cars come down the alley, they have difficulty turning/seeing traffic on Penn. The law states that cars should be 5 feet from an alley entrance
 - Neighbors request that BMNA pay for signs from city that say "no parking" with arrows. Each sign will cost \$250.
 - Motion to approve the expenditure unless there is pushback from the businesses closest to the alley. If there is pushback, come back to the board. Area 6 Rep., Barry Schade moved ,Area 2 Rep., Sue Verrett second.
 - Discussed the speed of traffic between Chestnut and Laurel on Upton Ave. Possibilities
 to help included speed bumps, painting at intersections, changing the speed limit. Jay
 Peterson will check with city about changing the speed limit to 20 mph
- 8. Garden of Hope and Healing Dedication—Patty Wycoff
 - The garden is complete.
 - Dedication ceremony planned for Sunday, October 25th at 12:15.

Bugle Income and Expense tracking budget so far. So are Operations expenses

Member donations down 8% from budget. This reflects a continuing year by year decline of revenue over the past 5 years from a peak of \$16,000-\$17,000.

4th Quarter forecasts:

1. Community Gardens:

There is an additional \$7,600 in Program and Project Expense so far in October for Community Gardens. \$5300 is for the Garden of Hope and Healing final construction invoice. \$2,300 is for the Penn Avenue median rehabilitation.

Outside of Garden of Hope & Healing, Community Gardens project expenses tracking budget. Will likely be a little over budget by end of year as winterizing activity expenses come in

City Funding:

Still expecting City CPP funds not yet received (about \$19,000 budgeted)

3. Communications/Internet/Web site:

Web site redesign is scheduled for 4th quarter. Expenses will be about \$12,000-\$15,000 estimated. \$16,000 has been budgeted for redesign + webmaster. This category will likely end up about \$5,000-\$6,000 over budget by year end.
